Food Business Basics Workshop & Training	2-3	<p>The original quarantine for Spotted Lanternfly in NJ has been extended from 3 to 8 counties. The original 3 were Warren, Hunterdon, and Mercer. The expanded quarantine zone, including the original 3, now encompasses Burlington, Camden, Salem, Gloucester, and Somerset Counties.</p> <p>For more information on what this quarantine entails, please refer to the Rutgers NJAES website, https://njaes.rutgers.edu/spotted-lanternfly/, and the NJDA website, https://www.nj.gov/agriculture/divisions/pi/prog/spottedlanternfly.html. Flyers and handouts in both English and Spanish along with homeowner and landscaper treatment recommendations and other outreach and informational resources are also provided there.</p> <p>“If you see it, kill it,” said Dan Keashen, a spokesman for Camden County. “Those insects should be eliminated and destroyed. They are an invasive species. They can wreak havoc with the agricultural community, and they can destroy crops en mass.”</p> <p>In addition to killing these insects — the same way you would kill any unwanted bugs inside your home, by squashing them or spraying them — Keashen said residents of Camden County should report their sighting to the county entomologist by calling 856-374-6042.</p> <p>People in other New Jersey counties are advised to report any spotted lanternfly sightings to the state Department of Agriculture’s special hotline number — 833-BADBUG-0</p>

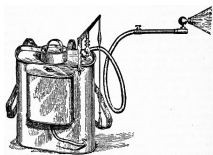

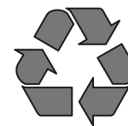
Pesticide Container Recycling for 2019

PLEASE DO NOT DROP OFF CONTAINERS UNLESS IT IS DURING THE SCHEDULED COLLECTION PROGRAM

Plastic Pesticide Container Processing Steps & Size Limits:

1. ALL pesticide containers must be either triple rinsed or pressure rinsed and drained and;
2. ALL pesticide containers must be free of residue (other than stains);
3. The booklet must be removed (you do not have to remove the paper labels glued to the container or the plastic sleeves);
4. Foil seal must be removed;
5. Only non-refillable pesticide containers will be accepted – you should drill a ¼-inch hole in the container or with a utility knife make a slit in the of the container so the container will not hold liquids;
6. Only pesticide containers embossed with HDPE or the recycling #2 will be accepted;
7. Pesticide containers up to 55-gallons in capacity will be accepted. 5-gallon pales must be cut in half; 30-gallon containers into at least 4 pieces; and 55-gallon containers into at least 6 pieces. This can be accomplished using a sawzall, chainsaw, circular saw, or reciprocating saw. It is not necessary to cut up containers less than 5-gallons; and
8. Pesticide containers must have originally held an EPA registered pesticide.

Items That Will Not Be Accepted and Will be Returned to the Recipient:

1. Pesticide containers with dried formulation on the container, pour spout or the spout threads;
2. Pesticide containers with liquid residue;
3. Pesticide containers where the insides are caked with dried residue;
4. Mini-bulk, saddle tanks and nurse tanks, which can be made of fiberglass;
5. Pesticide containers with lids; or
6. Containers that held any type of petroleum oil product or antifreeze.

Non-Waxy Cardboard Collection: Cardboard from Helena Products ONLY

Helena Chemical Woodstown will also be accepting, at no charge, non-waxy cardboard since their products are sold to the end users in cardboard boxes. Every Friday during the months of April through October 2019 during the scheduled pesticide container collection times, cardboard will be accepted. Clean non-waxy cardboard must be broken down and flatten.

2. Click on “Pesticides” on the left side of the screen
3. Scroll down and click on “Pesticides” in the About Us section
4. Click on “Verify the Date of Your Exam”
5. Scroll down to “Pesticide Certification Exam Sign-Up Info” and look for which one your last name falls under. [A through I, J through Q, or R through Z]
6. Select your last name in the drop down box
7. Enter your birthday in this format MM/DD/YYYY
8. Enter the last 4 digits of your social security number
9. Hit Submit
10. The report will give you two options to view it, PDF or Excel. Click on PDF or Excel
11. It will then download onto your computer
12. Click on it at the bottom of your screen to open it

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

Directions

From the North:

1. Take the NJ Turnpike to Exit 7
2. Take 295 South to Exit 26 (Rt. 42 S)
3. Proceed South on Rt. 42 to Rt. 55 South
4. Proceed South on Rt. 55 for about 29 miles
5. Take Exit 29 to Rt. 552 West (left turn)
6. Go approximately 3 miles into Carmel
7. Turn right at the stop light onto Morton Ave.
8. Go 1 – 1 ½ miles North on Morton Ave.
9. The Extension Center is on the left (brownstone & cedar-shingled building). There are two entrances and a sign on the road in front of the building.

From the Northeast:

1. Take Garden State Parkway South to Exit 44
2. Go South on Rt. 575 to Rt. 322
3. Turn right (North) onto Rt. 322 and proceed about ¼ mile to the Rt. 40 jug handle at the shopping center (Hamilton Mall)
4. Proceed West on Rt. 40 approximately 7 miles to Rt. 552 (left turn)
5. Proceed West on Rt. 552. After about 12 miles, you must take a right turn onto Sherman Ave. which is still Rt. 552 West
6. You will go through a Vineland residential area, cross Rt. 47, and cross the overpass of Rt. 55
7. At the stop light (~3 miles from the overpass), turn right onto Morton Ave.
8. Go 1 – 1 ½ miles North on Morton Ave.

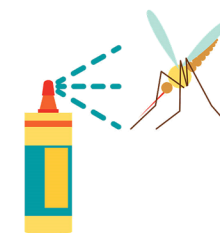
